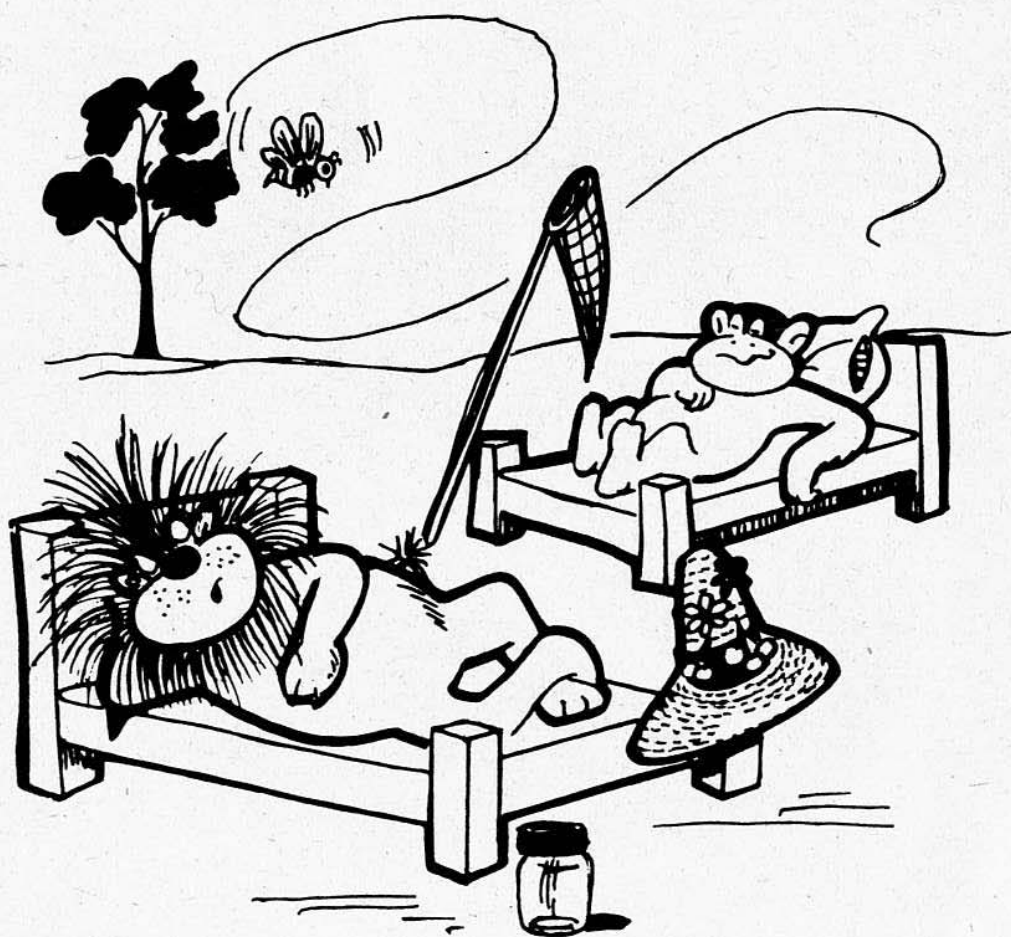

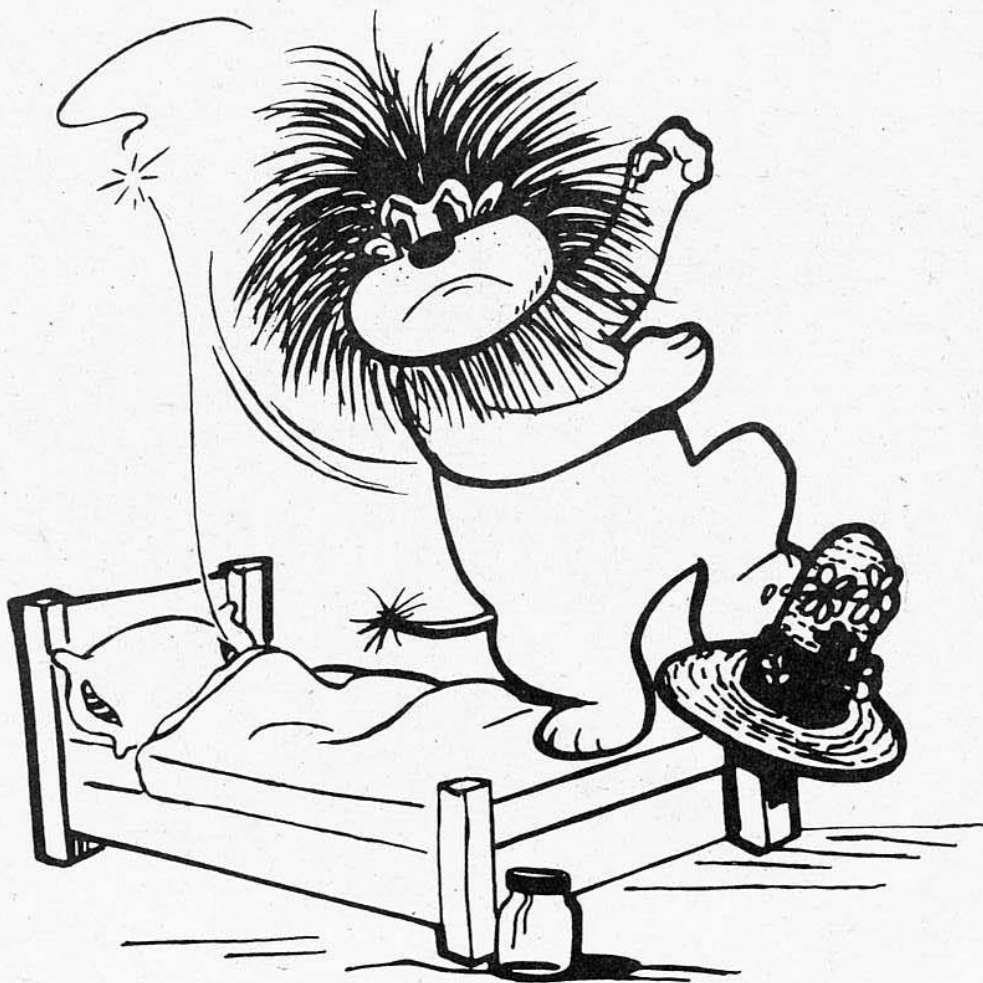


Sam is in his bed.

Mit is in his bed.

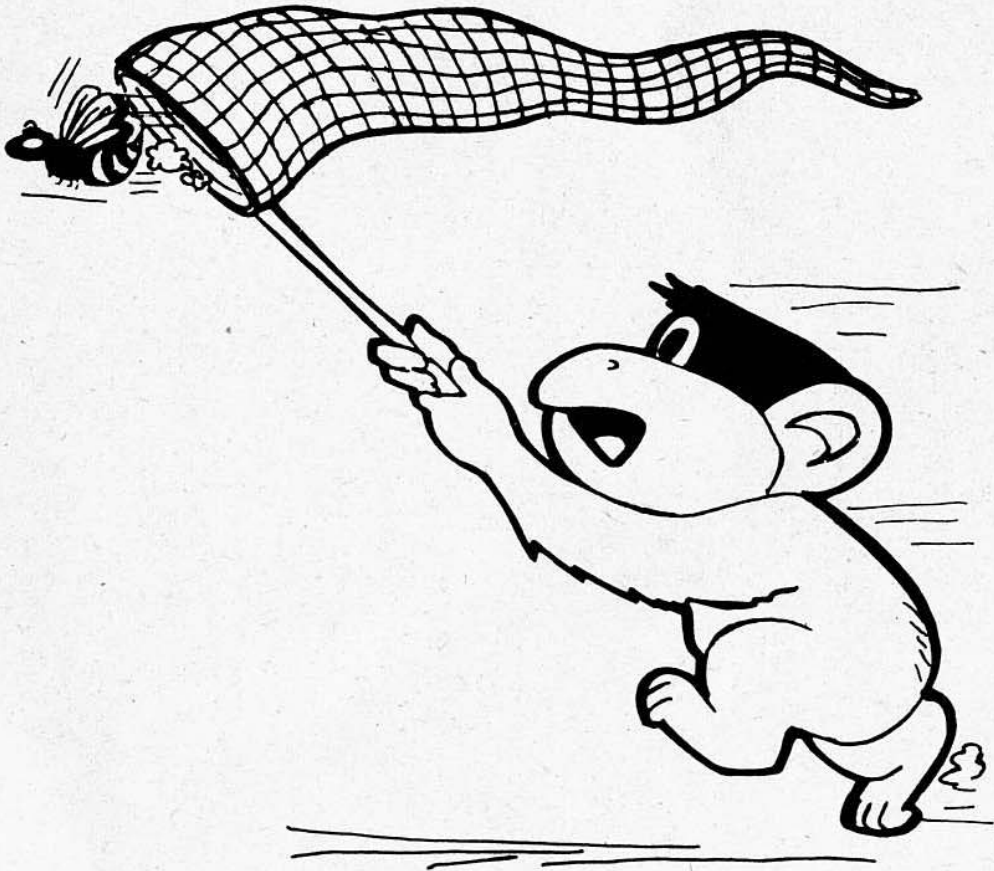


"Sam, Sam, I see a bee."



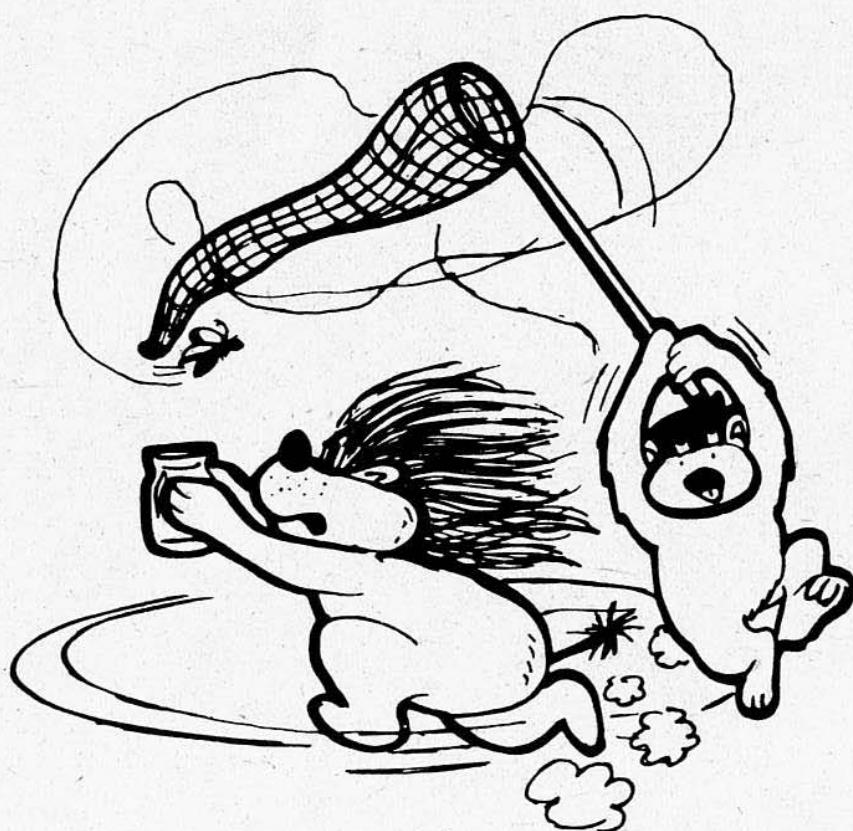
Bill the Bee hid in the bed.

Will Bill fit in this net?"

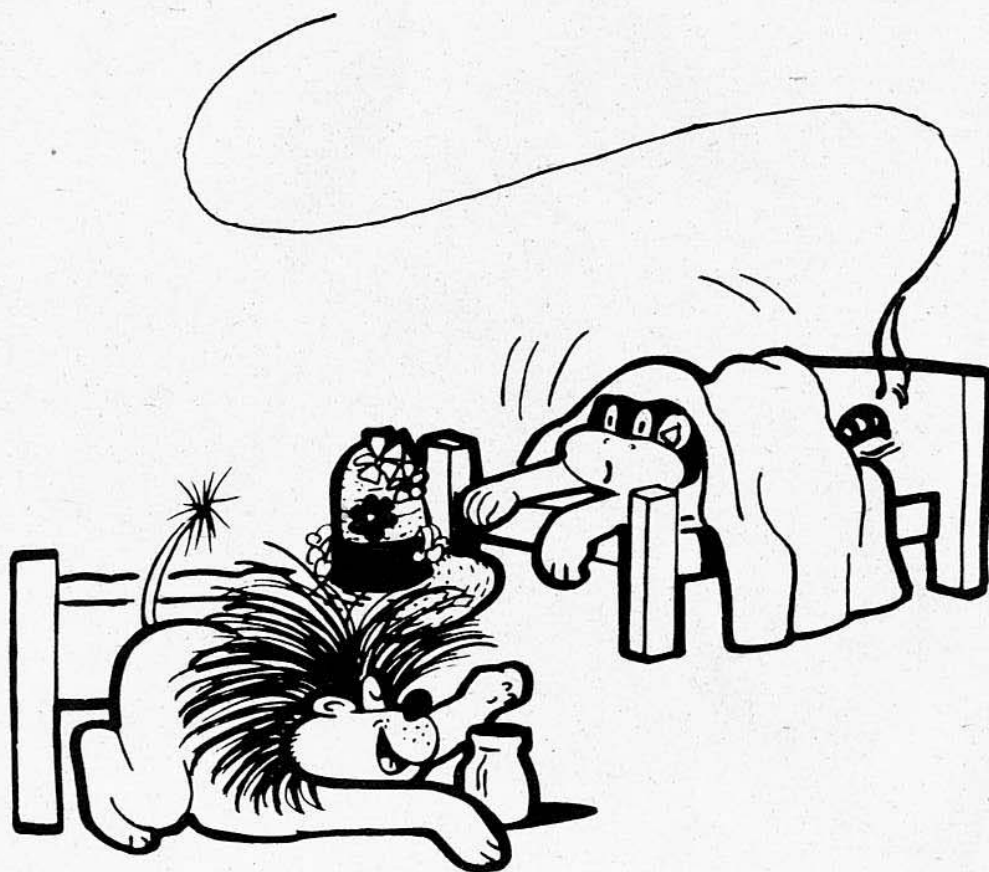


"I wish that bee was in this net."

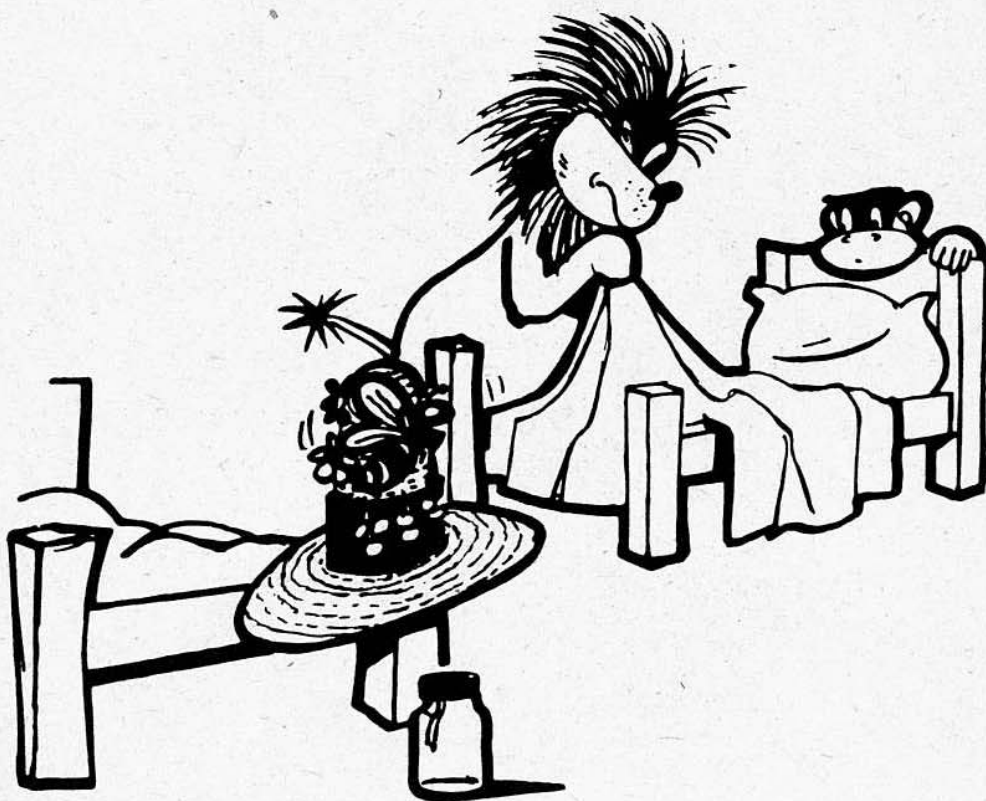


Mit hid in his bed.

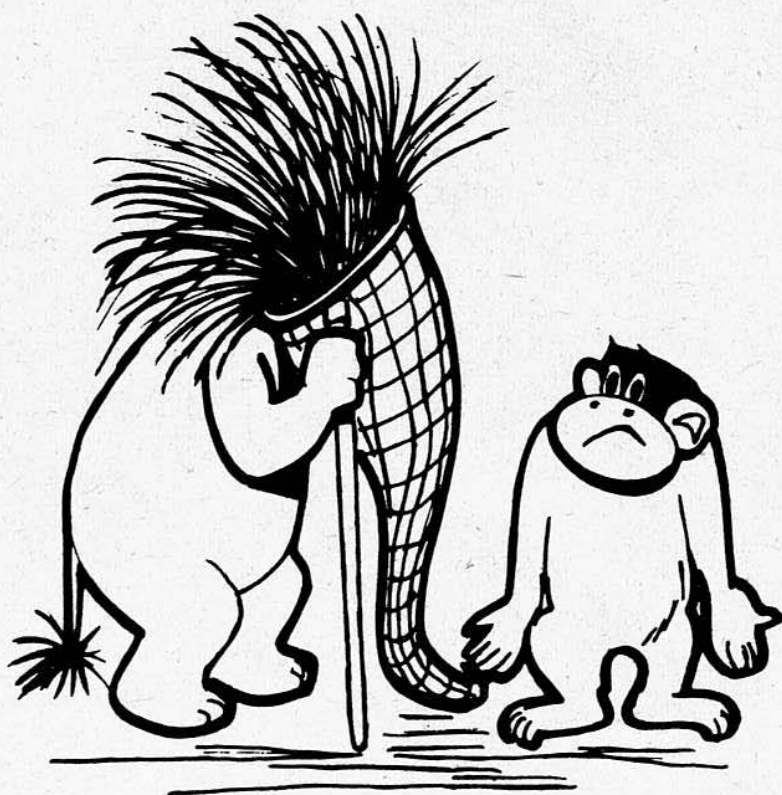
Did Bill see him?

Sam sees if the bee hid in the net.



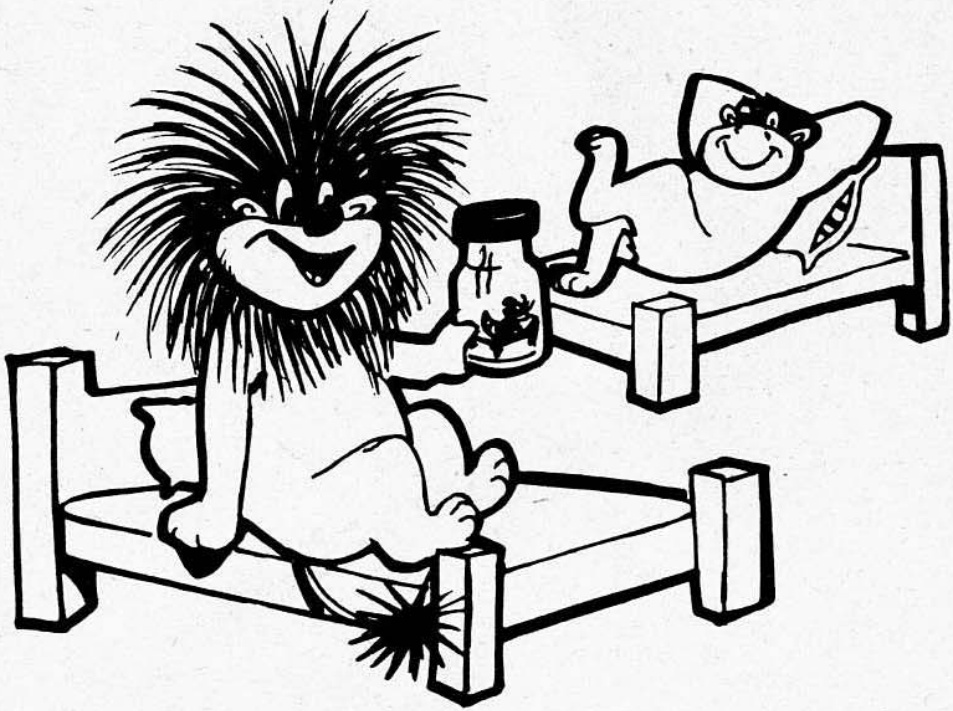
"Is Bill on this hat, Mit?"

But see him, Mit?

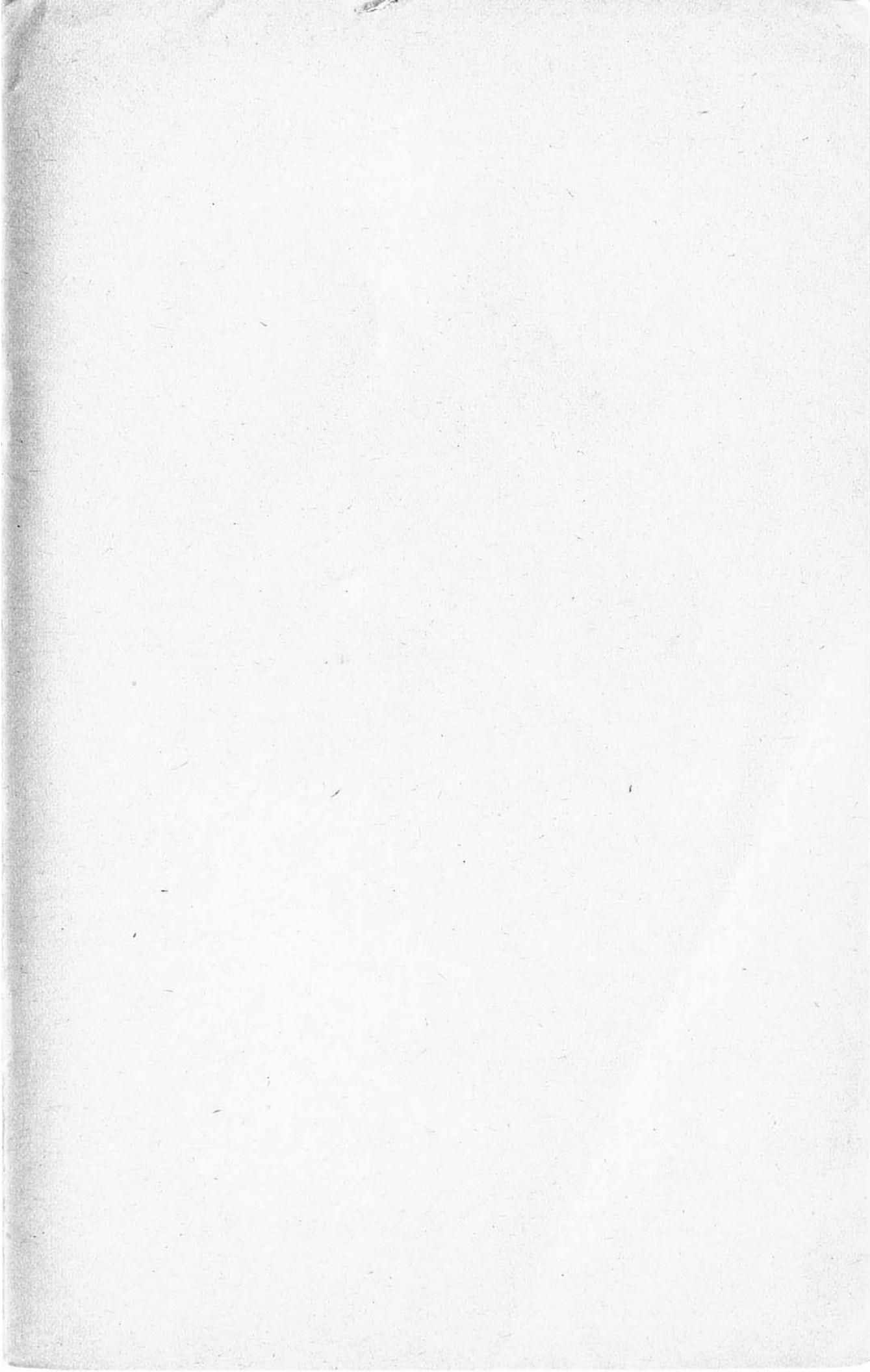
Bill is in the net."

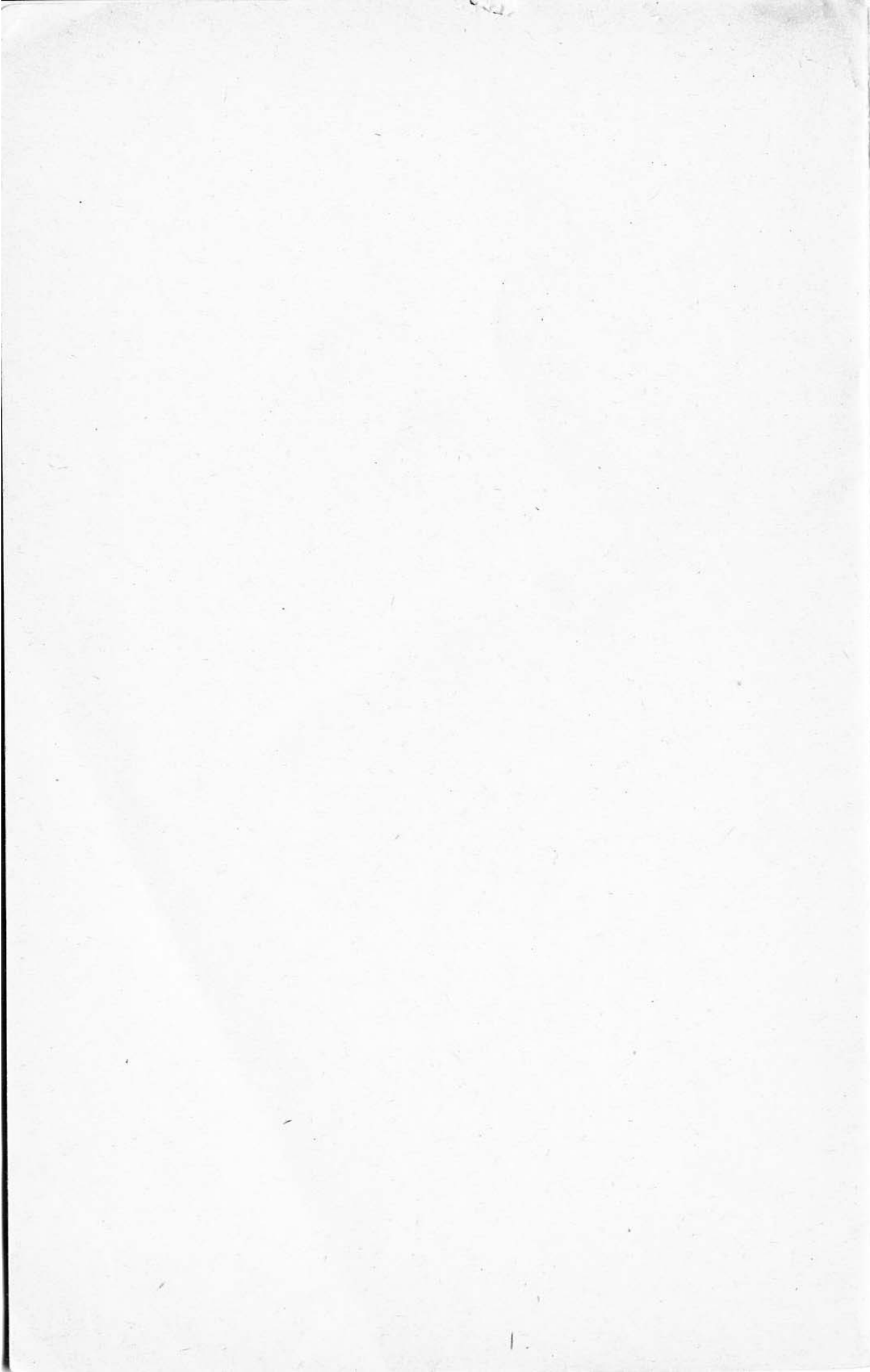


"I am in this bed.
